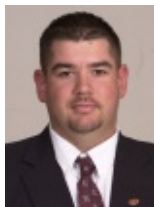

Our Coaching staff includes College Coaches from all different levels (D1, D2, D3, NAIA) & some of the best High School OL coaches in the Lone Star State.

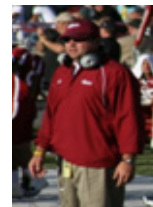


A key to the success of the WT passing game is it's offensive line. The person charged with overseeing that unit is **Billy Best**, now in his fourth season with the Buffalo coaching staff. Best also handles the additional duties of Associate Head Coach.

Over the past two seasons, the Buffalo offensive line has provided protection for a unit that led the nation in passing while ranking among the top-three, nationally, in total offense. Over those two seasons, the Buffs have allowed just 37 QB sacks in 1,306 passing attempts. Individually, linemen J'Marcus Webb, Devario Dorsey, Tommy Crowley and Pat Schwenke have earned all-Lone Star Conference honors under Best's guidance, with Webb earning several all-America mentions. The 2006 season saw Best assist in the production of three all-LSC offensive linemen.

Prior to joining WTAMU, the Rayville, La., native spent two seasons as the offensive coordinator at Ranger College in Ranger, Texas, where he also handled recruiting duties. As recruiting coordinator at Ranger, Best oversaw the transition of new players into the program and many outbound players into the systems of four-year institutions. Best has also coached at the high school level in Louisiana, spending time at Farmerville, Bolton and Delhi High Schools.

Best played collegiate football at Millsaps College and the University of Louisiana-Monroe, earning his bachelor's degree in health and human performance from ULM in 2001. He received his master's from WTAMU in 2007.



Coach **Mason Miller** has served as the Assistant Head Coach at New Mexico State and McMurry University and will continue his duties as the offensive line coach. In 2008 the New Mexico State offensive line saw it way to help Chase Holbrook become 4th all time, with touchdown passes and passing yards, in the WAC. During 2007 the offense finished fifth in the nation in passing offense. The O-line also protected Aggie quarterback Chase Holbrook, who finished ninth in the nation in total offense with 322.6 yards per game. Miller also coached left tackle Mike Martinez who earned second team all-WAC honors in 2007.

With Miller's guidance in 2006 the Aggie offensive line had a breakout year. The Aggie O-line helped record five 100-yard rushing games and finish third in the nation in total offense, second in passing offense and 15th in scoring offense. Miller and the offensive line were also responsible for the protection of quarterback Chase Holbrook, who broke 21 school records in 2006. The Aggies recorded three games with over 500 yards passing, five games with over 400 yards passing and 11 games with over 300 yards passing.

In 2005, Miller coached an offensive that helped NMSU break several passing records, including passing attempts for a season (547), most completions in a season (310) and most completions in game (40). The NMSU passing offense ranked second in the WAC, while ranking seventh in total offense with 344.4 yards per game. The offensive line helped the Aggie rushing attack recorded four 100-yard rushing games, including three consecutive games with 100 yards or more on the ground, something that hadn't happened since 2000.

Prior to NMSU, Miller coached running backs in 2003 and offensive line in 2004. SLU averaged 537 yards of total offense and 408 yards passing per game, both tops in NCAA Division I-AA. The running game also improved. SLU averaged just over 74 yards per game in their first season in 2003 to 129 yards per game in 2004. At SLU Miller coached Ray Perkins who is second in single season rushing yards with 1,148. He also guided center Donald Usry at Southeastern, who signed a free agent contact with the Baltimore Ravens in 2007 as well as guard Nick Cole at NMSU, who signed a free agents contact with the Eagles in 2006.
